Bargaining Highlights

GNWT

Last round of bargaining took place in September. Both parties agreed to return to the bargaining table the week of January 29, 2018.

NTPC

On September 28, 2017 bargaining between the UNW and NTPC stalled and came to a impasse. The parties will be filing for mediation.

Over the past couple of months strike votes have taken place in various communities and our members have been casting their ballots in a fight against a brutal employer. The outcome of the vote will indicate whether NTPC employees authorize the union to call a strike, if necessary. The strike vote results may or may not be released. This will be a strategic decision of the UNW bargaining team prior to mediation.

The math is simple for every member who voted YES it gives the bargaining team more power to negotiate the best deal possible at mediation.

Hassan Yussuf, CLC President Addresses Delegates at the 17th Triennial Convention



First elected to the position of President for the Canadian Labour Congress in May 2014, Hassan Yussuf has led Canada's unions in a number of significant victories. In a passionate address to Convention attendees he spoke on a number of topics important to our members today. He highlighted the importance for a stronger Canada Pension Plan and the tabling of Bill C-26 which lead to the expansion of CPP. He reminded the audience that joining a Union is a fundamental right and that all workers in Canada have the opportunity to join a Union of their choice. As the UNW continues to negotiate with the GNWT he also emphasized that the right to strike is a fundamental right protected by the constitution. In conclusion he reiterated that we are currently negotiating with a difficult employer and encouraged members to continue their fight.

In the coming months, we hope to catch drivers on their way to work and remind listeners the benefits your union brings to Northern workers.



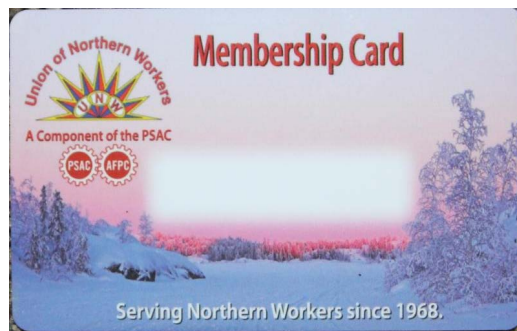

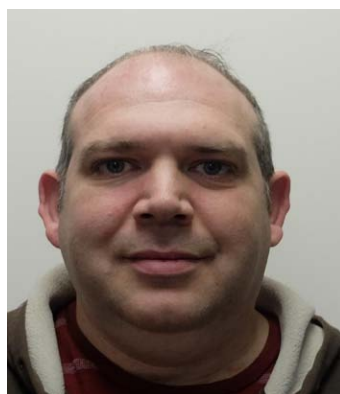

25K Raised for YWCA at 17th Triennial Convention

UNW delegates, observers and guests opened their wallets and hearts as \$25, 000 was raised for the YWCA, GirlSpace program here in Yellowknife. The Silent Auction at the Convention banquet raised \$5,000, which was later matched by the UNW Executive. The contributions didn't stop there. In a point of privilege Local 3050 donated \$1,000 and challenged other Locals to contribute. The challenge was accepted and Locals 2,3,6,9,10,11,13,21,33,345 met the challenge.

Locals 1, 2 and 22 raised the bar by donating \$2,000 dollars to this worthy cause. And thanks to an anonymous donor the \$25,000 mark was achieved. The GirlSpace program offers girls 8-17 years old the opportunity to work collaboratively with other girls to develop a space where everyone feels welcome and respected, learn, grow and share in a non-judgmental environment supported by professional staff, build skills, including leadership, teamwork, self-reliance, increased independence, self-awareness and positive self-esteem, and connect with the community in a variety of volunteer roles.
